In-depth news documentaries offering an unflinching and compelling look at complex, vital and often-controversial subjects.

FRONTLINE: PRESIDENT TRUMP (Tuesday, January 3 at 10:00 pm) Examine the key moments that shaped President-elect Donald Trump from real estate developer to entertainer to president.

FRONTLINE: DIVIDED STATES OF AMERICA (Tuesday, January 17 and 18 at 9:00 pm) Review the partisanship that gridlocked Washington and charged the 2016 presidential campaign. 2-part series.
