CRAFT IN AMERICA (Friday, September 29)

BORDERS (9:00 pm) Explore the relationships and influences Mexican and American craft artists have on each other and on our cultures. The program features traditional weaving and the creation of paper jewelry.

NEIGHBORS (10:00 pm) Travel to and from the U.S. and Mexico to explore the people, history, traditions and crafts, noting how aesthetics cross from one country to another and back again in an organic and ongoing cultural exchange.

HUMAN INTEREST & HISTORY

COMING OF AGE IN AGING AMERICA (Monday, September 4 at 10:00 pm) It's widely accepted that most Americans are living decades longer than any generation in human history. This longevity has far-reaching implications for society, and experts, policy makers and the general population are only just beginning to grapple with how to reframe our thoughts on aging. What does it mean for communities, programs and policies, and how we live and work? *Coming of Age in Aging America* is a penetrating documentary that probes these questions.

POV: THE GROWN-UPS (Tuesday, September 5 at 11:00 pm) In a school for individuals with Down Syndrome, four middle-aged friends yearn for a life of greater autonomy in a society that marginalizes them as disabled. Get a humorous and at times tragic look at the limbo of conscious adults.
